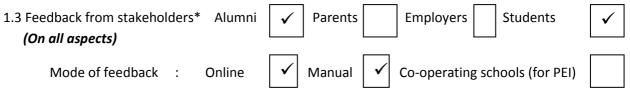





### 5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression





- 3 In order to promote and cater the need for ICT in teaching- learning most of the departments had been equipped with LCD and a computer with internet connection.
- 4 To enhance learning resources Library was upgraded with 1893 new text books including reference Books. Journals & e-journals have been continued.
- 5 Total 1493 students availed the scholarships of Rs. 62,872,58/ from the college under various government schemes.
- 6 To help economically poor students, scholarships were distributed from Students Aid Fund (SAF) scheme and also with the contribution from staff members. Total 33 students availed the Rs. 18,838/
- 7 In order to implement the curriculum effectively, an orientation session was organised to make the staff and students aware of the revised pattern of curriculum.
- 8 A workshop on curriculum development and implementation was also conducted for the staff.
- 9 To make students aware of their social responsibilities and create inclusive society, many social awareness programs were conducted through, Women Empowerment Cell, NSS & ACE
- 10 Environmental Cell of the college conducted many awareness programs for the environmental protection and its conservation.
- 11 Students were encouraged to excel in curricular and co-curricular activities. Academic toppers at university level from each group were felicitated on INDEPENDENCE DAY, while extracurricular and sport players were felicitated on REPUBLIC DAY.
- 12 Training and placement cell of the institute conducted a training program for the students.
- 13 Students were encouraged to participate in intercollegiate games and sports events. A total of 130 (98 boys + 32 girls) students participated in various intercollegiate games and sports events. Total Prizes won by the students = 03

### **Best Practices 1**

#### **Students Feedback Analysis**

Along with regular feedback system (Questionnaire on paper) trial runs were carried out for electronic feedback system using Google forms and data base of student email address. A twofold system was introduced for 1) Blind fold analysis 2) Weighted analysis.

Questionnaire was designed and is in process of modifications based on service quality parameters.

#### Curriculum

The parameters used in the student's feedback analysis are course content, completion of theory and practical classes, availability of reading materials etc.

#### Analysis

For B.Sc. courses,

About 30% of the students indicated that the current syllabus is of challenging level, weighted analysis suggested most of the student belong to slow learners category.

About 50% of the students indicated that the current syllabus is manageable, weighted analysis suggested most of the student have good percentage in 12<sup>th</sup> and don't prey to ATKT system

Remaining students feel that syllabus is non-contemporized.

For B.Com. courses,

Students find that the current syllabus is manageable, but its practical approach should be enhanced. Lack of subjects like e-commerce/ tally was pointed out by about 10% student. Weighted analysis suggests that these 10% students belongs category of advance learner.

### **Teaching Learning and Evaluation**

Knowledge, Communication/ Presentation, Sincerity, Punctuality, Regularity, Accessibility/ Availability, Interest in Subject, Behavior, Assignments/ Curricular Activities were the key points used in the feedback format.

### Analysis

All the departments have excellent performance in conducting and execution of syllabus and its contents. Student learning behavior was judged through preliminary and unit test which helped faculties in completing objective. Assignments and co-curricular activities was helpful to students in scoring better at university exam.

### Student support and governance

Counseling and guidance provided by faculties, Services offered by the office for Admission process, Scholarship and concessions, Examination process were judged.

### Analysis

#### Action taken

The feedback on curriculum was carefully analyzed by the committee members and the following necessary steps are taken:

1. The grievances and suggestions are conveyed to the Members of Boards of Studies.

2. Necessary steps are taken to make the study materials available and course material to be provided by the faculty.

3. The analysis of feedback was conveyed to the respective teachers by the IQAC through the chairman.

### **Best Practices 2**

1. Title of the practice :- Adult and Continuous Extension Education Program (ACE)

2. Goal :- To uplift the social status of peoples of economically weaker section , college/ school dropouts students, the effort are being taken to bring them in main stream of society.

3. The context :- In our surrounding area many underprivileged and poor people are residing. Usually they are not aware about the basic medical needs/facilities, environmental and social problems. Through A.C.E. practice we try to aware the mass group of people in a scientific ways.

4. The practice :- Under the scheme of A.C.E. hundreds of students from the institution are enrolled to work for the adult and continuous education. They have been guided and motivated by teachers to aware illiterate people in the society. In such programs, street march, street plays and slogan contest is regularly organized. Various social, educational and cultural events are being organizes in our institution. There are many challenging issues which we use to aware the society. By educational rallies on international literacy day, also programs is organized on international ozone day and international science day.

5. Evidence of success :- A.C.E. unit of our college always contributes through social awareness programs to educate the people. Various events are organized to draw attention of masses. International literacy day was celebrated with great zeal and enthusiasm. A rally was organized from the college covering 5 k. m. distance of the slum area of North Nagpur. More than 600 students participated with posters and handouts to encourage literacy mission. The rally made a good and fruitful impact not only on the illiterate people living in slum areas but also on the economically weaker sections. Various environmental awareness programs like essay competition on "climate change and its impact" was organized. International science day celebrated with great enthusiasm in the college to aware students and common people regarding development of science.

6. Problems Encountered & Resource required: - It is experienced that during various rally's through the slum areas people were not interested for the same so, it is very big task to create their interest in such programs for that some Government organization and N.G.O. should be involved for the success of such programs.

### 7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection

- Energy conservation: posters are displayed in laboratory and corridors depicting the message for conservation of energy. Miniature Circuit Breakers are installed at the entry of each class room to control wastage of energy. Students are instructed to put off the light & fans while leaving the room.
- Use of Renewable energy:- Solar based illumination systems are installed in the college premises to ensure the maximum use of solar energy.
- Water Harvesting: Rainwater harvesting system is installed in college premises to ensure the maximum conservation of rain water. Students are demonstrated regarding awareness of water conservation.
- **Plantation**: The College organizes regular plantation drive to make the college campus green and aesthetically beautiful. This year also the plantation program was organizes and plants of various species were planted at different places in the vicinity of college campus. In addition of that college has beautiful garden having various species of ornamental and other plants with botanical importance. College garden also has green net house to maintain shade loving plants and to protect the plants during summer.
- Hazardous waste management:- The microbiology department use to perform various experiments on different micro-organisms. After completion of experiments, all the culture tubes, plates & flasks are autoclaved; it is the regular practice which microbiology department performs. After autoclave, they used to pour all the pathogenic and non pathogenic materials in properly dig pits. Also department of zoology use to perform various experiment on fishes, pila, leaches and earthworms etc. They used to destroy all the materials properly by digging pits and pouring the used animal into the pits.
- Nirmalya Sankalan at Naik Talao during Ganesh idol immersion. In this activity 85 volunteers sensitized devotees for adoption of eco-friendly idol immersion. They further educated & made aware masses about pollution hazards, need of clean environment and green earth. About 8 teachers and 2 non-teaching members guided & also participated in work.
- World population day was celebrated on 11<sup>th</sup> July 2014 and essay completion was organized on increasing population and remedy.
- Tree plantation program in our college was undertaken on 16<sup>th</sup> Sept. 2014 to celebrate international ozone day.
- On 1<sup>st</sup> Dec. 2014 AIDS awareness program was organized and Dr. Agnihotari enlighten the students on the topic.
- Dr. Manorama Gourkhede renowned Gynaecologist delivered a talk on topic "Intimate hygiene of female" on the occasion of Mahila Mukti Diwas organised by Women Empowerment cell.
- Women empowerment cell and Physical education department organised training program on "Suryanamaskar and Yoga for Women" on the occasion of national youth day from 12<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> Jan. 2015
