EYE CHECK-UP CAMP

National Service Scheme (NSS) unit, Rotaract club and Extension Activity cell of Dada RamchandBakhru Sindhu Mahavidyalaya had organized an Eye Check-up camp in association with Mahatme Eye-bank & Eye Hospital. Camp facilitates free eye check-up, free sickle cell test, free specs. Camp witnessed an overwhelming response of 446 free eye check-ups out of which 18 patients in which cataract was detected and 3 with squinting will be operated free of cost at Mahatme hospital. 87 patients were scanned for sickle cell. 70 specs were distributed free of cost to the needy patients which were sponsored by Rotary club, CA Gaurav Kaushik and CA Jay Kaushik.

 - 3. To professionalize disaster risk reduction (DRR) and emergency management in India and other neighbouring countries by developing an independent cadre of professionally trained emergency and mitigation managers.
 - 4. To promote formal training and education for Disaster Management in India and in the region.
 - 5. To build working partnerships with the Government, universities, NGOs, corporate bodies and other national and international institutes of eminence.
 - 6. To link learning and action by building a synergy between institutions and professionals in the sector.













Brochure:

Basics of Disaster Management elaborates the need for understanding the concept of disaster and how people can prepare and manage disasters at micro and macro level, focusing more on people's participation Both at urban and rural level.

Disaster Management deals with management of assets and information for a disastrous occurrence is concerned and also how effectively and impeccably one coordinates and mitigates these calamities. Disaster management, at the institutional arrangements level, deals with issues of planning, coordinating, communication and hazard management.

Traditionally, even in the legal framework, the meaning of disaster has been taken narrowly. Enforcement of Public Safety Regulations is not effective. Low income and Poverty creates problems in matters of preparedness. Professional skills for field machinery in matters of disaster management still lack.

Disaster management aims to reduce, or avoid, the potential losses from hazards, assure prompt and appropriate assistance to victims of disaster, and achieve rapid and effective recovery. Disaster Risk Management includes sum total of all activities, programmes and measures which can be taken up before, during and after a disaster with the purpose to avoid a disaster, reduce its impact or recover from its losses

Much of the gap exists between disaster research and community capacity building. There are instances of policy makers lacking the Disaster Management experience. Potential of exservicemen available between countries is not used well. International or bilateral cooperation in Disaster management is not up to the mark.

Inaugural Session

Welcome Address: The program was announced open with the welcome address by Dr. V.M. Pemdsey (Officiating Principal) Dada Ramchand Bakhru Sindhu Mahavidyalaya. With words of appreciation for this program, he emphasized on the value of different sorts of 'Basics of Disaster Management', wherein experiences from the field could be shared by the eminent speakers via the virtual platform.

<u>Inaugural Address:</u> Shri H.R. Bakhru, President, Sindhi Hindi Vidya Samiti shared his hopefulness about the program especially for the case studies that were going to be presented in the sessions, for relatable and effective understanding of the participants. His emphasis on the requirement of disaster studies marked a motivating beginning of the program.

Keynote Address: Prof Anil K Gupta Head of ECDRM, NIDM addressed the key note of the session. He clarified that disasters are not natural, he shed light on the contemporary concerns of the professionals in mitigating disasters. Explaining how NIDM is set-up and its functions. Duly acknowledging the limitations during COVID-19 pandemic, Prof Anil K Gupta Head of ECDRM, NIDM expressed that this online webinar program organized in collaboration with Dada Ramchand Bakhru Sindhu Mahavidyalaya, Nagpur (Maharashtra) is an effort to democratize Disaster Risk Reduction, highlighting that DRR is a collective responsibility of various stakeholders in a society

<u>Special Address</u>: **Dr. Vinky Rughwani Chairman, Sindhi Hindi Vidya Samiti** began the session by extending his hearty greetings and welcoming all the esteemed dignitaries, key speakers, and participants of the training programme. He expressed great pleasure on behalf of NIDM in collaboratively working with National Institute of Disaster Management (Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India)













Speakers:



Shri Shekher Chaturvedi (Assistant Professor, NIDM) shared a presentation on Institutional Framework. Sir spoke on Disaster Management Act on grounds of institutional, legal, financial and coordination mechanisms at the National, State, District and Local levels. These institutions are not parallel structures and will work in close harmony. The new institutional framework is expected to usher in a paradigm shift in DM from a relief-centric approach to a proactive

regime that lays greater emphasis on preparedness, prevention and mitigation. The NIDM, in partnership with other research institutions, has capacity development as one of its major responsibilities, along with training, research, documentation and development of a National level information base. It will network with other knowledge-based institutions and function within the broad policies and guidelines laid down by the NDMA. It will organise training of trainers, DM officials and other stakeholders. The NIDM will strive to emerge as a 'Centre of Excellence' in the field of Disaster Management.



Dr. Sushma Guleria (Assistant Professor, NIDM) shared details on the basics of Disaster Management. With the help of a few figures and photographs, she explained the physical vulnerabilities of different types of buildings. She brought to light the problems that concern a system which need to be improved upon while implementing DRM, especially while planning CBDRM. Her presentation informed the participants of the officially recognized disasters by the High Powered

Commission (HPC). She rightly emphasized on the need of looking and understanding the different institutional set-ups of DRM. In context of CBDRM and institutional implementation of the same, Dr. Guleria spoke about the requirement of local-level planning via the Gram Panchayat Development Plans which talk about the integration of Disaster Management in development planning.













Aradhna Moktan (YP,NIDM) lectured on Mitigating Risk and Awareness and shared a case study on Mendha Lekha Village on Forest Rights Act. She shared how major disasters such as earthquakes, landslides, storms, cyclone floods have something very unique, it offers a unique chance for settlement to turn their disaster vulnerability into disaster Resilience. Thus risk reduction and mitigation measures should be integral or prime parts for Raising of public



awareness, bringing changes in structural and non-structural risk reduction elements, and the need to educate the public concerning their own behavior. Risk reduction also needs to be mainstreamed into the central flow of government policies and planning and whenever we talk about planning and policy making the role of communities and its participation plays a very important role.













Key Takeaways:

- There is an important practical application of the definition of disaster in the realm of disaster management. Such definition helps provide a common concept and theme throughout disaster management activities. Thus, the chosen definition is valuable for purposes of policy, organization, planning, and legislation.
- Natural phenomena such as earthquakes, cyclones, volcanic eruptions, tsunamis, wildfires, floods, landslides, and drought still persist. So, does their basic man-made counterparts such as major accidents. These disasters continue to cause grievous human casualties, economic and social loss, and damage to the environment.
- The primary responsibility for dealing with disasters must rest with the national government. In addition, an important disaster management concept is to ensure optimum use of existing resources, the majority of which tend to be under government direction.
- Awareness of the youth on the importance of skill training and education and strategy to be adopted would be through skit, group work interventions. Mobilizing and networking with NGOS and government sectors to enhance their quality of life through various skill training programmmes.
- In framing a national disaster management policy, these organizational aspects must be carefully considered and included in the relevant policy statement. In this regard, it is usually prudent to frame the policy so that minor adjustments to organizational arrangements can be made without having to amend the policy itself.
- Any disaster management organization must therefore cater to appropriate community involvement and participation. This applies particularly to relevant aspects of preparedness, response, and recovery action. In fact, in framing and/or checking organizational effectiveness, it is advisable to consider requirements at community level first.
- Strengthening young people's capacities to be effective humanitarian actors, and support local youth-led initiatives and organizations in humanitarian response.
 Increasing resources to address the needs and priorities of adolescents and youth affected by humanitarian crises and use the new gender and age marker for better tracking and reporting.













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



5. Background:

Pandemics have a severe impact on physical and mental health of children. It has also been directly and indirectly exposed to children and their families. The direct and indirect factors have created stress and emotional disturbance among children and their families. The mental health of millions of children worldwide has been put at risk, with at least one in seven forced to remain at home under nationwide public health orders or recommendations during the COVID-19 pandemic. More than 330 million youngsters have been stuck at home, till March 2021, for at least nine months, since the virus spread uncontrollably last year. During the pandemic, many parents and caregivers were forced to work from home and lost their financial independence due to job losses. The pandemic brought a complex array of challenges which had mental health repercussions for everyone, including children and adolescents. Grief, fear, uncertainty, social isolation, increased screen time, and parental fatigue have negatively affected the mental health of children. Friendships and family support are strong stabilizing forces for children, but the COVID-19 pandemic has also disrupted them. The pandemic has created fear among children and they are also felt physical and mental stress due to job losses of their parents because most of the parents are unable to feed their children, as many of them were dependent on midday meal school programmed. It has become difficult for parents to calm their children's anxieties because of the uncertainty and stress in their own lives. The occupational or emotional challenges parents face is interfering with their usual ability to address their children's needs and worries. Children especially of rural and migrant labourers have been severely affected during pandemics. School closures have also exacerbated their physical and mental health of children, reinforced to transform into online /digital mode of learning. It is not unusual for children to experience negative emotions such as fear, disappointment, sadness, anxiety, anger, loss etc. But it is the prolonged, restrictive, and widespread nature of the COVID-19 pandemic that has exacerbated the situation. Increased screen time, strained family relations or sedentary lifestyle at home pose





additional challenges. (SourceUNICEF). Education and learnings of 67.6% of students are impacted globally due to coronavirus in 143 countries. The transition away from physical classes has significantly disrupted the lives of students and their families, posing a potential risk to the mental well-being of children. The pandemic leaves a negative impact on children's mental health, and can lead to higher rates of depression, anxiety, and post-traumatic stress disorder. This causes fear in children because the virus threatens not just them but also their families and surroundings, especially as they see their parents working from home, leading to fear and shock. An abrupt change in the learning environment and limited social interactions and activities poses an unusual situation for children's developing brains. It is essential for the scientific community and healthcare workers to assess and analyze the psychological impact caused by the coronavirus pandemic on children and adolescents, as several mental health disorders begin during childhood. Context

India, due to its geographical location, is vulnerable to a variety of natural and man-made disasters that impact the growth of the country and various developmental activities also are put to stand still. Programme Details

Programme started with welcome address by Dr. Naveen Kumar Agarwal, Registrar DRBSMV. Dr. Agarwal thanked NIDM for collaborating with DRBSMV to conduct the webinar. He also welcomed the participants and the panelists for attending the webinar. After Dr. Agarwal's welcome address, Shri Shekher Chaturvedi, briefed the participants about the details of the programme and need of the subject. He also conveyed the good wishes of ED NIDM for the success of the webinar. He then informed the participants about the role which NIDM has been mandated under DM Act and how the Institute is progressing to achieve it. Then Shri H R Bakhru, President Sindhi Hindi Vidya Samiti (SHVS) shared his experiences during his inaugural address. He said that disasters are everywhere and timely intervention by all concerned can reduce its impact. He thanked NIDM for choosing Sindhu Mahavidyalaya for reaching out to masses. After the inaugural address of Dr. Vinky Rughwani, Director SHVS






addressed the participants. He also thanked ED NIDM for collaborating with Sindhu Mahavidyalaya for deliberating upon such an important topic. Then Dr. I P Keswani, General Secretary, SHVS addressed the participants and shared his experiences. He congratulated the organising team of both the institutions for conducting webinar on involvement of institutions of higher education in DRR activities. Dr. V M Pendsey, Officiating Principal of Sindhu Mahavidyalaya also addressed the participants during the inaugural session. He said that the webinar has given many, a learning opportunity for making contributions in reducing the risk of disasters.

After the inaugural session, the technical session began with Shri Shekher Chaturvedi, Assistant Professor, NIDM making a presentation on Role of Higher Education in Disaster Risk reduction. During his presentation, Shri Chaturvedi, said that the New Education Policy 2020 has thrown open many dimensions about higher education such as flexibility in completing the courses, practical involvement during courses, Single point of governance of higher education management etc. He also explained the issues which will emerge when mainstreaming of DRR into higher education takes place. This will include extension of roles of faculty, provisions of new areas of research with less available data, lack of trained personnel etc. He also shared the roles which higher educational institutions will have to play through their administration, faculty and students. He also highlighted the initiatives taken by NIDM for mainstreaming DRR into Higher Educational Institutions through India Universities and Institutions Network for DRR under the Agenda 6 of Hon'ble PM's ten-point agenda for DRR.

The last session of the programme was focussed on building resilience and empathy through higher education. During this session, Dr. Sushma Guleria, Assistant Professor, NIDM discussed about problems pertaining to mental health, its well-being being faced by students, faculty and administration of the higher education. She said that such problems have been aggravated by the pandemic. Students are worried about their future, technical streams have been undergoing studies without being exposed to practicals, etc. faculties and administration also are short of replies to many querries of students related to their future. There has been huge impact on mental well-being of students with all this prevailing. She also talked about stress, PTSD and psychological trauma which is gaining its grounds in terms of its impact. She said that release of pressure is the best way to calm the needy and subsequent to this bringing him/her back to society with dignity helps him/her regain normalcy and start contributing to the society. She discussed various tools which can help in releasing pressure and regain normalcy.

The programme ended with valedictory address by Dr. V M Pendsey, Officiating Principal of Sindhu Mahavidyalaya. During his address, Dr. Pendsey reiterated the importance of the contents of the programme and thanked NIDM faculty for delivering the topics with ease of making understand. He thanked organising team for their contributions. Shri Arun Verma, Young Professional NIDM then presented a formal vote of thanks.





Key Takeaways:

- 1. Every stakeholder has a role to play for contributing for reducing the disaster risk.
