NSS Pledge

(27th Sep 2023)

The objective of the program is to foster patriotic sentiments and unity among the students. About 120 students and 9 faculty members participated in it.

Eye Check-up Camp (6th April 2024)



NSS unit our college had organized a Free Eye Check-up camp in association with Mahatme Eye-bank & Eye Hospital at Adarsh krida park, Tandapeth, Nagpur on 6th April 2024. Camp facilitates free eye check-up and distribution of specs at minimum cost for needy once. This initiative aimed to promote eye health and ensure access to vision correction for all. Through community engagement and support, we strive to make a positive impact on people's lives. Our efforts continue to bridge gaps in healthcare accessibility. Camp witnessed an overwhelming response. A total of 98 individuals had their eyes tested, and affordable spectacles were provided to those in need. 19 patients in which cataract was detected will be operated free of cost at Mahatme hospital. More than **20** volunteers worked hard for the success of the camp.

Blood Donation & Thalassemia and Sickle cell testing Camp

(13th September 2023)



National Service Scheme (NSS) unit along with Saarthi Alumni Association of Dada Ramchand Bakhru Sindhu Mahavidyalaya had organized blood donation and Thalassemia and Sickle cell testing camp on 3rd Feb 2023 in association with Jeevan Jyoti Blood bank and Rotaract Club of North Nagpur. 51 people including students, teaching, non-teaching staff and many others donated the blood in the camp. Certificates, water bottles and refreshment had been given to the donors. 146 people came forward to test their Blood pressure, Haemoglobin, blood group etc. 102 people tested for Thalassemia and Sickle cell. CPR Demonstration

(15th March 2024)

Services at bone marrow testing camp for Thalassemia & Sickle cell Patients

(12th Feb 2024)



A free human leukocyte antigen genes (HLA) testing camp was organized for thalassemia and sickle cell patients, their siblings, and their relatives at Rughwani Child Care and multi-specialty Center by Dr. Vinky Rughwani and Dr. Shantanu Sen (Mumbai). Thalassemia and Sickle Cell patients underwent HLA Matching with their siblings and parents. Those patients in which the HLA got matched with their siblings and parents will further proceed for bone marrow transplantation which is the only permanent cure for Thalassemia and Sickle Cell patients. 12 volunteers from our unit worked over there and learned the importance of scanning for these diseases, testing methods and organizations of such camps for the welfare of society. These volunteers helped the foundation team in the registration process and well as in sample collecting.

Services at the Health camp at Diksha Bhoomi
