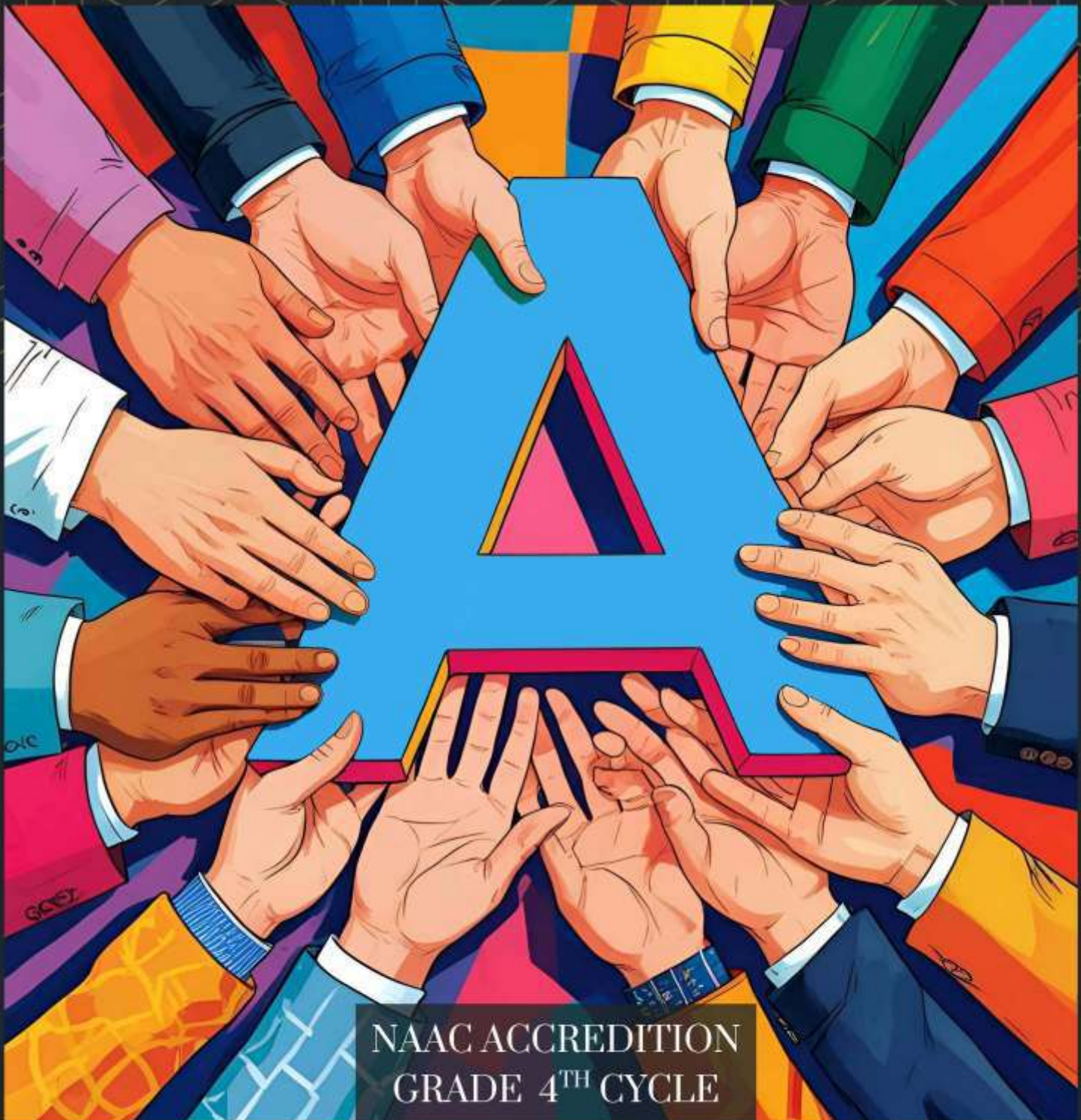

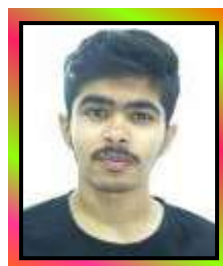

NAAC Visit - October 2024

Progressive Efforts of the Institution for Upgrading NAAC Grade from B to A

DRB Sindhu Mahavidyalaya has consistently worked hard towards enhancing the quality of education, research, infrastructure and governance with the aim to improve its NAAC accreditation status from grade B to grade A. Internal Quality Assurance cell was established in the year 2004. Since then it has taken effort to improve quality of education that has helped in improving the NAAC accreditation. Though team IQAC took painstaking efforts to upgrade the NAAC grade from B to A in the years 2013 and 2019 we are now ultimately successful in achieving our target A grade in the year 2025.

It was a continuous process to interrogate ourselves and to start working in the required direction. IQAC team members of the institute analysed results after third cycle of NAAC and accordingly planned the strategy to achieve better grade in the fourth cycle of NAAC. This report outlines the systematic and progressive steps undertaken under various criteria as described by NAAC to ensure quality enhancement and sustenance.

Curricular Aspects -

At the initial stage Academic calendars for the academic year 2018-19 to 2023 24 were made which included diverse activities and their successful implementation was monitored by IQAC members. In the previous cycle of NAAC the Institute had 4 certificate courses. In the 4th cycle the institute's number of Certificate courses rose up to 27 and simultaneously number of students enrolled in various certificate courses also increased and reached up to 90%. Number of students who under took project work also increased. New programs like M.Sc in Botany, Zoology, Chemistry and Mathematics have been introduced in the last five years. Ph.D the centre for higher learning has also been established. IQAC planned and monitored the organization of programs through Department and Cells on cross-cutting issues. IQAC also collected the feedback forms from all the stakeholders.

Teaching-Learning and Evaluation -

Faculty development programs were organised by IQAC. Faculties were encouraged to pursue Ph.D and research publications. Teachers were encouraged to use smart classrooms and LMS integration like Moodle and Google Classroom. As, a result their teaching enhanced. Student- centric methods such as experimental learning, group discussions, participative learning, flipped classrooms, peer learning, projects, presentations, field visit, educational tours, industrial visits, seminars and group discussions were executed and all the documentation as per the SOP by NAAC was maintained. Focus on Outcome Based Education (OBE) with clearly defined learning outcomes and rubrics was undertaken. For the first time the attainment of POs and COs were evaluated in this cycle

Research, Innovation and Extension -

For research promotion under the aegis of Research and Innovation Cell, Incubation Sub Centre approved by RTM Nagpur University was established. Also there was an increase in the number of journals, publications, books, patents and proceedings. For the collaboration MOUs were signed with industries and institutions for joint research and internships. Extension activities Cell increased participation in number of extension and social outreach programs. Number of activities conducted by the institute were 170 in last 5 years which were five times more as compared to third cycle.



Infrastructure and Learning Resources -

Infrastructure development was the major task to be executed. New labs and seminar halls were constructed. Also computers and upgraded IT infrastructure with 200 mbps internet speed were installed. Library modernisation was key development factor. The institute has a digital library with access to e resources NPTEL and INFLIBNET. Green campus initiative such as solar panels, rainwater harvesting and solid waste management systems were implemented.

Students Support and Progression -

Training and Placement Cell strengthened the support in the placement thus improving the campus placement ratio. The institute extended financial aid and took steps to facilitate government scholarships as well as institutional scholarships to deserving students. Through meets Alumni network was strengthened and their involvement in institutional development was significant. The Alumni Association donated Generator to the Institution. Students participation at large and activities in sports and cultural activities at University /State/ National level also increased. Various Skill enhancement cells and career guidance cells for students support functioned vibrantly.

Governance Leadership and Management -

Institute believes in decentralized governance. Hence participatory decision making through Committees and Cells was made effective. IQAC team prepared and adopted a 5 years strategic plan, focusing on NAAC criteria and quality benchmarks. IQAC worked on organisation of more proactive programs for quality improvement, AQAR submission, NAAC, NIRF, feedback and quality audit. It encouraged administrative staff training and participation in e-Governance. The institution has performance appraisal system and effective welfare measures for teaching and non teaching staff.

Institutional Values and Best Practices -

Faculties of all departments were motivated to start at least one best practice of the department. Green Audit and Energy Conservation was done for sustainable development. Programs were initiated to promote women empowerment. Sustainability practices were promoted through awareness on EVS by organising workshops.

Outcomes Achieved -

- * Improved student satisfaction and academic performance
- * Higher faculty research output
- * Enhanced industry linkages and student employability
- * Stronger institutional reputation and stakeholder confidence

Conclusion -

Through collective efforts and a structured quality enhancement road map, the institute has demonstrated significant progress in all the seven NAAC criteria. These continuous improvements have helped the institute in an excellent position of upgrading its NAAC grade from B to A in the 4th accreditation cycle.

There were no incidences of ragging during the session in the college campus.

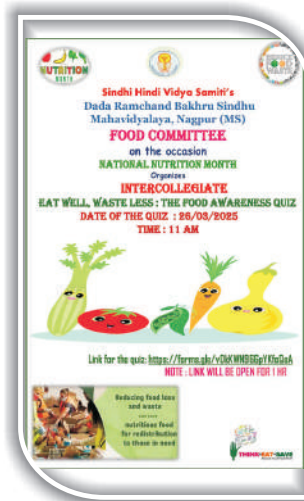


Food Committee

Introduction to the Constitution of India

It was adopted on November 26, 1949 and came into effect on January 26, 1950 a day celebrated as Republic day. The Constitution establishes India a sovereign, socialist, secular and democratic republic, ensuring Justice, Liberty, Equality and Fraternity for all its citizens.

Drafted by the Constituent Assembly, the Indian Constitution was influenced by various global Constitutions including those of the USA, UK, Ireland and France. Dr. Ambedkar, the Chairman of the Drafting Committee played a crucial role in shaping the document.

The Indian Constitution is known for its comprehensiveness and flexibility. It consists of preamble, fundamental rights, Directive Principle of States Policy and fundamental duties ensuring a balance between individual freedom and States responsibility. It also provides for a parliamentary system of government, federal structure, independent judiciary and provision for amendments.

As the longest written constitution in the world, it serves as a living document evolving to meet the changing need of society. It guarantees democracy, protects rights and ensures governance based on equality, justice and rule of law.

History of the Constitution of India

The history of the constitution of India dates back to the colonial period. Before

independence India was governed under the government of India Acts with the government of India Act 1935, serving as the main constitutional framework. However, with the demand for self-rule growing, the need for a new constitution became evident.

The Constituent Assembly was formed in 1946 to draft India's constitution. It had 299 members with Dr. B. R. Ambedkar as the Chairman of the Drafting Committee. After nearly three years of discussion and debates, the Constitution was adopted on November 26, 1949 and came into effect on January 26, 1950.

The Indian Constitution established India as a sovereign, socialist, secular and democratic republic. It provides a framework for governance, fundamental rights and duties. Since the adoption of Constitution it has undergone several amendments to adapt to the country's changing needs. The Constitution remains a living document, ensuring justice, liberty and equality for all Indian citizen.

Key Features of the Indian Constitution

The Constitution of India is a comprehensive document that defines the country's governance, rights and responsibilities. Some of its key features include.

1) Preamble

The preamble reflects the philosophy of the Constitution declaring India as a sovereign, socialist and democratic republic that ensures justice, liberty, equality and fraternity.

2) Fundamental Rights



Articles 12-35 provide essential rights such as the right to equality, right to freedom, right against exploitation, right to freedom of religion, cultural and educational right and right to constitutional remedies.

3) Directive Principles of State Policy (DPSP) inspired by Ireland - These principles (Articles 36-51) guide the government in ensuring social and economic justice.

4) Fundamental Duties

Added through the 42nd Amendment (1976), these duties (Article 51A) remind citizens of their responsibilities towards the nation.

5) Parliamentary System of Government-

India follows a parliamentary democracy where the President is the constitutional head and the Prime Minister is the executive head.

6) Federal structure with Unitary Features -

India has a quasi federal system, meaning it has both federal and unitary characteristics, ensuring a strong central authority while granting power to states.

7) Independent Judiciary

The Supreme Court, High Courts and Lower Courts ensure justice and protect fundamental rights. These features make the Indian Constitution a dynamic and evolving document, ensuring democracy, justice and equality for all.

Conclusion -

The Constitution of India is the foundation of the country's democracy, governance and legal system. It ensures justice, liberty, equality and fraternity for all citizens, making India a sovereign, socialist, secular and democratic

republic. As a living document, it has evolved through amendments to address social, political and economic challenges.

नोबेल पुरस्कार

नोबेल पुरस्कार विश्व का एक ऐसा विशिष्ट, प्रतिष्ठित पुरस्कार है जिसे भौतिक, रसायन, चिकित्सा, साहित्य, शांति आदि के क्षेत्र में विशेष योगदान देने वालों को दिया जाता है। इस पुरस्कार को देने की शुरुआत 'अल्फ्रेड नोबेल' ने की थी। इसलिए इस पुरस्कार का नाम नोबेल पुरस्कार रखा गया। अल्फ्रेड नोबेल ने अपने जीवन में 300 से अधिक पेटेंट कराए थे। संपूर्ण दुनिया उन्हें डायनामाइट के आविष्कार के लिए जानती है। इसके दुरुपयोग से आहत होकर उन्होंने स्वयं की संपत्ति से नोबेल पुरस्कार प्रदान करने का विचार किया। अतः उन्होंने अपनी वसीयत में लिखा कि उनके संपत्ति से प्रतिवर्ष शांति, विज्ञान, साहित्य आदि विभिन्न क्षेत्रों में पुरस्कार दिए जाएँ। और तभी से उनकी वसीयत अनुसार भौतिक और रसायन के लिए रॉयल स्वीडिश एकेडमी ऑफ साइंसेज द्वारा, मेडिसीन के लिए कारो लिंस्का इंस्टीट्यूट द्वारा एवं साहित्य के लिए स्वीडिश एकेडमी द्वारा और शांति के लिए नार्वेजियन संस्था द्वारा नोबेल पुरस्कार प्रदान करती है।

नोबेल पुरस्कार हेतु प्रत्येक देशों के मंत्री, विश्वविद्यालय के प्रोफेसर, पूर्व नोबेल पुरस्कार विजेता, नार्वेजियाई नोबेल समिति के वर्तमान व भूतपूर्व सदस्य सहित नोबेल समिति द्वारा सूचीबद्ध लोग या संस्थाएँ पुरस्कार हेतु नाम के प्रस्ताव दे सकते हैं।

इस पुरस्कार हेतु सितंबर से फरवरी तक आवेदन मँगाए जाते हैं। तत्पश्चात संबंधित समितियाँ नामों पर विचार करती हैं। अक्टूबर में नोबेल

विजेताओं की घोषणा की जाती है और 10 दिसंबर अल्फ्रेड नोबेल की जयंती के अवसर पर विभिन्न अलग-अलग क्षेत्रों के पुरस्कार विजेताओं को नोबेल पुरस्कार से सम्मानित किया जाता है। इस पुरस्कार के अंतर्गत पुरस्कृत व्यक्ति को लगभग 9 करोड़ की राशि, प्रमाणपत्र, 18 कॅरेट सोने से बना लगभग 175 ग्राम वजनी पदक प्रदान किया जाता है।

शांति के लिए नोबेल पुरस्कार नार्वे की राजधानी ओस्लो में दिया जाता है और बाकि के नोबेल पुरस्कार स्वीडन के स्टॉकहोम में दिए जाते हैं।

हमारे भारत में आजादी के पूर्व भी और आजादी के बाद भी अनेक व्यक्तियों ने इस पुरस्कार को अर्जित किया है। उन विजेताओं की सूची और उसके क्षेत्र इस प्रकार है -

संविधान दिवस, जिसे राष्ट्रीय कानून दिवस भी कहा जाता है, हर साल २६ नवंबर को मनाया जाता है। यह दिन हमारे संविधान के निर्माता डॉ. भीमराव आंबेडकर को श्रद्धांजलि देने और संविधान की महत्ता को समझने का अवसर है।

डॉ. आंबेडकर ने सामाजिक समानता, न्याय और मानवाधिकारों के लिए अपने जीवन को समर्पित किया। उनके विचार आज भी हमें प्रेरणा देते हैं। डॉ. भीमराव आंबेडकर के प्रेरणादायक विचार, हर भारतीय को अपने जीवन में अपनाने चाहिए।

डॉ. आंबेडकर ने हमेशा शिक्षा को सबसे बड़ा परिवर्तन को माध्यम माना। उनका मानना था कि शिक्षा हर व्यक्ति को आत्मनिर्भर और समाज में समानता लाने का जरिया बनती है।

संविधान का महत्व -

संविधान का महत्व भारत में बहुत है क्योंकि यह तय करता है कि समाज में निर्णय लेने की शक्ति किसके पास है। एक सरकार अपने नागरिकों पर क्या थोप सकती है, इस पर कुछ सीमाएँ भी हो सकती है। लोगों के मौलिक अधिकार संविधान

की देन हैं और इससे यह सरकार की समाज को इच्छाओं को पूरा करने में सक्षम बनाता है। संविधान सरकार की शक्तियों को सीमित कर सकता है और लोगों द्वारा राजतंत्र बनाने का अधिकार देता है।

- १२) भारतीय धर्मनिरपेक्षता
- १३) स्वतंत्र नागरिकता
- १४) एकल नागरिकता

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भारतीय संविधान की अवधारणाएँ

परी सोनवाय

बी.कॉम. (प्रथम वर्ष)

भारत के संविधान की प्रस्तावना की मुख्य अवधारणाएँ :

१. “हम भारत के लोग” : यह आरंभिक वाक्यांश भारतीय लोगों की संप्रभु इच्छा को दर्शाता है। यह घोषणा करता है कि संविधान को अपना अधिकार किसी बाहरी या विरासत में मिली शक्ति से नहीं बल्कि सीधे भारत के नागरिकों से प्राप्त होता है।

“हम भारत के लोग” कहकर प्रस्तावना संविधान के लोकतांत्रिक आधार पर जोर देती है, यह पुष्टि करते हुए कि लोग राष्ट्र में सभी शक्ति और अधिकार का अंतिम स्रोत हैं।

२. **संप्रभु** : संप्रभु शब्द भारत की एक राष्ट्र के रूप में पूर्ण और स्वतंत्र स्थिति को दर्शाता है। इसका अर्थ है कि भारत किसी भी बाहरी शक्ति के नियंत्रण से मुक्त है और उसके पास घरेलू और अंतरराष्ट्रीय स्तर पर अपने निर्णय लेने का सर्वोच्च अधिकार है।

यह अवधारणा संविधान के विभिन्न अनुच्छेदों में निहित है, जैसे कि अनुच्छेद ५१, जो राज्य को अपने घरेलू और विदेशी मामलों पर पूर्ण नियंत्रण बनाए रखते हुए अंतरराष्ट्रीय शांति को बढ़ावा देने और आंतरराष्ट्रीय कानून के प्रति सम्मान को बढ़ावा देने का निर्देश देता है।

३. **समाजवादी** : हालाँकि समाजवादी को १९७६ में २४ वें संशोधन द्वारा प्रस्तावना में जोड़ा गया था, लेकिन यह अवधारणा पहले से ही सामाजिक न्याय और संसाधनों के समान वितरण पर संविधान के फोकस में निहित थी।

समाजवाद की अवधारणा राज्य नीति के निर्देशक सिद्धांतों (अनुच्छेद ३८, ३९ और ३९अ) में परिलक्षित होती है, जो राज्य को आय और स्थिति में असमानताओं को खत्म करने और सामाजिक, आर्थिक और राजनीतिक न्याय सुनिश्चित करने के लिए मार्गदर्शन करते हैं।



४. **धर्मनिरपेक्ष** : धर्मनिरपेक्ष शब्द को १९७६ में ४२ वें संविधान संशोधन द्वारा प्रस्तावना में भी जोड़ा गया था, हालाँकि भारतीय राज्य की धर्मनिरपेक्षता का अर्थ है कि राज्य किसी विशेष धर्म का समर्थन नहीं करता है और सभी धर्मों के साथ समान व्यवहार करता है। यह धार्मिक स्वतंत्रता का सम्मान करता है और सुनिश्चित करता है कि नागरिक अपनी पसंद के किसी भी धर्म का पालन, प्रचार और प्रसार कर सकते हैं।

अनुच्छेद २५ से २८ तक धर्म की स्वतंत्रता के अधिकार का प्रावधान करते हैं, यह सुनिश्चित करते हुए कि व्यक्तियों और समूहों को बिना किसी भेदभाव के अपने विश्वासों का पालन करने और प्रचार करने का अधिकार है।

५. **लोकतांत्रिक** : भारत में लोकतंत्र अर्थ है, “लोगों की, लोगों द्वारा और लोगों के लिए” जिसका अर्थ है कि भारतीय राज्य अपने नागरिकों की सक्रिय भागीदारी और सहमति से काम करता है।
